

## Student Knowledge Hunt – Newcomers Questions and Answers

As an introductory activity to the *Mavericks: An Incorrigible History of Alberta* web site, students may take five to ten minutes to become familiar with the site and answer the specific questions they have been provided.

- 1. What luxury items did the Csavossy brothers bring with them to Canada?
  - A. They brought train cars full of property, including 250 pounds of family silver, their art collection, and their library.
- 2. Josef Csavossy called himself Alberta's first "flying farmer." What did he buy in 1928 to gain this nickname?
  - A. A Tiger Moth airplane
- 3. What type of art form were Thomas and Lena Gushul known for?

  A. Photography
- 4. Why was Samuel Livingston trying to get to Fort Edmonton in 1864 or 1865?
  - A. He heard there was a gold strike
- 5. Sam Livingston occupied and cultivated his land but did not hold the legal title for it. What is a person called who did this?
  - A. A "squatter"
- 6. In 1912, how much did James Mah Poy have to pay as a "head tax" to bring his wife to Canada?
  - A. \$500.00
- 7. What is Florence Losandro famous for?
  - A. She was the only woman ever hanged in Alberta, and the last woman executed in Canada.
- 8. Emilio Picariello was known as a "bootlegger." What does this mean?
  - A. He transported and sold illegal liquor.
- 9. What was Morris Schumiatcher known for making?
  - A. Cowboy hats
- 10. What book did Mary T.S. Schäffer Warren have published in 1911?
  - B. Old Indian Trails of the Canadian Rockies
