

Knowledge Hunt: Ranching

ANSWER KEY

A "Knowledge Hunt" is a short quiz that includes 10 knowledge-based questions. These activities are meant to assist students in exploring and quickly becoming familiar with one of the theme areas. They may be used as a short, five-minute introduction to the content and navigation of the site or even as an online, small-group scavenger hunt. The Knowledge Hunts are available for teachers with or without answers. The version without answers is also contained within Student Resources or it may be printed off for student use.

As an introductory activity to the *Mavericks: An Incorrigible History of Alberta* information, students may take five to ten minutes to become familiar with the resources available here and answer the specific questions they have been provided.

- 1. Sam Livingston occupied and cultivated his land but did not hold the legal title for it. What is a person called who did this?
 - A. A "squatter"
- 2. What association was Sam Livingston President of?
 - A. Alberta Settlers' Rights Association
- 3. Why did Jane Livingston powder her face with flour?
 - A. To whiten her skin, afraid that an official would assume she was from a nearby reserve and demand to see her pass. Jane faced discrimination
- 4. In 1902, what did George Lane purchase?
 - A. The Bar U Ranch
- 5. What member of royalty visited the Bar U Ranch? What year?
 - A. The Prince of Wales in 1919
- 6. What was Tom Three Persons title at the first Calgary Stampede?
 - A. World's Bucking Horse Champion
- 7. How many cowboys rode Cyclone before Tom Three Persons rode him to a standstill?
 - A. 129





- 8. John Ware was the first man in Western Canada to do what?
 - A. Tie a steer in less than a minute
- 9. What did Mildred, John Ware's wife, help him with?
 - A. Reading and writing
- 10. How many horses were in the spring round up at the Bar U Ranch in 1885?
 - A. 500
